Spring is Just Around the Corner

After a tough winter, everyone begins to look forward to spring. When you begin planning for your spring clean up, remember Apple Valley can help. Our **Yard Waste Program** is perfect when cleaning up your yard. It's easy to use – and convenient. *The program works as follows:*

- \$2.00/Sticker – Stickers are purchased in lots of 5.
- Place yard waste at the curb by 5:00 a.m.
- Yard waste must be contained in a biodegradable paper bag or tied in bundles not to exceed four (4) feet in length and 35 pounds in weight.
- Each bag or bundle must have one sticker affixed to it in a location visible from the curb.
- Items must have stickers in order to be collected.
- Bags, cans and bundles of material cannot exceed 34 gallons in size and 50 pounds in weight.

Also, for larger clean up projects, be sure and schedule to have a 15-yard roll off container delivered from Apple Valley. These containers are ideal for residential spring clean up or "do-it-yourself" home projects.



The rate for this service is a one-time delivery fee of \$50.00 and \$250.00 for pick-up and disposal of the first two tons.

Grow Green

Do you know that you can cool your house in the summer and keep it warmer in the winter just by planting the right kind of vegetation? Smart landscaping (native plants, less grass) will also help you reduce the amount of water, pesticides, and fertilizers you use, while also cutting back on the noise and air pollution associated with mowing.

You can help keep your house cool in the summer by shading it with deciduous trees planted along its southern and western sides. In the winter, these trees will drop their leaves, giving you more sun for heating. To help block winter winds, plant evergreens or tall shrubs upwind (usually north and west). These trees should be about three times as far from the house as their height.

DON'T BE A LITTER BUG!

Roadside litter isn't just ugly to look at. About 80% of the trash in the world's oceans originates from sources on land, much of it litter washed into streams from roadside runoff. This harms our aquatic ecosystems, and can result in death for freshwater and marine life. Keep a couple of small trash bags in your car . . . and a bag to collect your recyclables.
